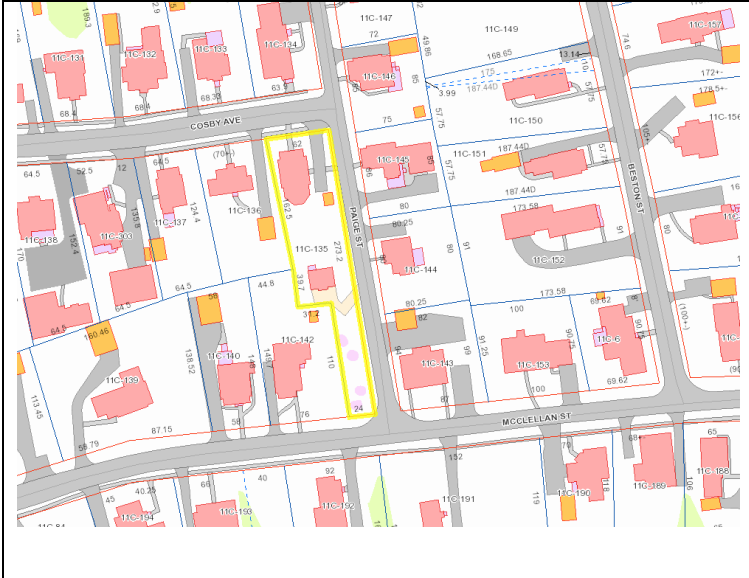

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

Two-story, front-facing gabled house with right-centered front door. This house mimics the other houses on Paige, but is a new house (2009) and is slightly taller with different fenestration. On the left side of building protrudes a shallow space with larger windows, in which the second story window has been modified to fit a pair of slender French doors and flush balcony.

HISTORICAL NARRATIVE

The house was built in 2009 by the owners of 37 Cosby; before 2009, it was a garden lot - and the garden now extends behind the new house to the south-west corner of Paige and McClellan. (See description of 37 Cosby for the main house which faces Cosby). The house is owned by Daniel Wallack and Joan O'Meara of 37 Cosby Ave, and is listed as owner-occupied.
